Description – Fellows will receive a stipend, health insurance, and financial support to attend the year-end CRF meeting, and supplementary research and training funds. Students matriculated at any U.S. medical school who are in good academic standing and have completed two or more years of medical school prior to the start of the fellowship are eligible to apply to any of the 12 participating schools. Participating schools must accept at least five fellows a year, two of which must be matriculated at another school. Program leaders and advisors at each school select the fellows. Each fellowship consists of a structured clinical research experience and coursework. Fellows' research projects focus on clinical research questions, and fellows attend an annual meeting at the end of the fellowship to present their research. The main goal of the program is to encourage medical students to pursue careers in clinical research. Interested medical students must be willing to take a year out from school and conduct fellowship research and training at one of 12 host research-intensive medical schools.
