The program reimburses eligible student loan expenses or pays an equivalent cash benefit to individuals who graduate from an Oklahoma accredited teacher education program, receive teaching certification in math or science, and agree to teach in an Oklahoma public secondary school for at least five years.

Teach For America is currently a member of AmeriCorps, the national service network. The program recruits new graduates of university programs in any area to give two years of teaching to poor areas in the United States. In an effort to ensure that qualified candidates of all economic situations are able to join our corps, we offer need-based transitional grants and no-interest loans to help corps members make it to their first paychecks. Packages range from \$1,000 to \$6,000 based on an applicant's demonstrated need and the cost of living in the assigned region. Salaries are paid by the school district at the beginning teacher rate. In addition to loan forbearance and interest paid on qualified student loans, each teacher receives \$4,725 at the end of the year of teaching.
