Thanks to all OkCC members who responded quickly to the needs of Katrina survivors in various ways including direct volunteering, fundraising, blood drives, alternate fall or spring breaks, collecting clothing, goods, waiving out-of-state tuition for displaced students, opportunities for displaced faculty, and much, much more. Two OkCC member institutions – **Langston University** and **Tulsa Community College** were recognized on a national list of those recognized for Katrina efforts. Rogers State University (RSU) ~ Dr. Nat Hardy. When he began teaching creative writing and literature at RSU last fall, assistant professor Nat Hardy established American Red Cross and Habitat for Humanity chapters on-campus. Students in Hardy's spring 2005 Composition II class volunteered with Habitat for Humanity and students in his current Composition I class are working with the American Red Cross to provide disaster relief for

those affected by Hurricane Katrina. Hardy leads by example by volunteering his own time with the Red Cross and was recently presented with an ARC award for "acts of courage, kindness, and noble character." Thank you for your efforts Dr. Hardy!



Oral Roberts University (ORU) ~ About 140 ORU students spent their fall break cleaning and rebuilding Tulsa's sister city of Long Beach, Mississippi (70 miles NE of New Orleans). Students, along with Tulsa Mayor Bill LaFortune and three employees of Guts Church spent the break cleaning houses, clearing debris, distributing food, and helping at a medical clinic.

Donations from Tulsa bankers, churches, and the Tulsa Auto Dealers Association made the trip possible. About 600 students showed up at the initial volunteer meeting to learn about various volunteer opportunities. Since then students have worked with the Red Cross, donated blood, raised money, and written cards to hurricane victims. Congratulations ORU!

► **Month of Action.** OkCC's Vocal Oklahomans in Civic Engagement (VOICE) initiative is pleased to invite OkCC member institutions to submit proposals to support activities for Month of Action, February 19- March 26, 2006. OkCC will award \$300 grants to five member institutions.

Over the past three years National Campus Compact's Raise Your Voice initiative has sponsored National Month of Action (MOA) as a way to demonstrate and promote the civic engagement of college students. Each year OkCC has provided sub grants to help support activities on Oklahoma campuses. In previous years, Oklahoma students organized campus dialogues, political engagement fairs, voter registration drives, drug and alcohol awareness day, food drives, breakfast with legislators, poster events, dialogues with the mayor, blood drives, community service events and more as part of MOA.
