- a. The Hispanic or Latino Origin population more than doubled (108.1%) from 86,160 in 1990 to 179,304 in 2000. The Hispanic working age population had a substantial increase of almost 120% over the 1990-2000-time period.

- b. *Oklahoma's EDGE* (Economic Development Generating Excellence) was initiated by Governor Brad Henry. Spearheaded by Secretary of Commerce and Tourism Kathy Taylor and Higher Education Chancellor Paul Risser, the project will bring together input from business leaders, university professors, and other experts across the state to design an economic action plan for Oklahoma.

OASIS (Oklahoma Association Supporting International Studies) This project seeks to narrow the international knowledge gap in Oklahoma. Students and teachers will be targeted with current information about the state and the economic importance of being fully engaged in international studies. Business and legislative leaders, likewise, will be informed about the most current state initiatives and what steps need to be taken to move forward. Oklahoma has made significant progress with the *OASIS* project by expanding the work on international and global education, e.g., the *OASIS* Ambassadors are K-12 teachers who are prepared to instruct other teachers in the infusion of international content throughout the curricula.

14. What model curriculum programs have been established which incorporate international knowledge and skills?

Model United Nations – The Model United Nations is a simulation of the United Nations system. Students assume the roles of ambassadors to the United Nations and debate current global issues. Participants seek ways, through diplomacy and negotiation, in which the world community can deal with complex global concerns such as the environment, economic development, refugees, AIDS, conflict resolution, disarmament, and human rights. Young people from diverse backgrounds participate in these educational exercises to experience first-hand decision-making processes and diplomatic work at the United Nations. Model United Nations of the Southwest runs an annual conference for about 400 high school and college students, at which participants simulate the United Nations. This is an excellent real-world experience for political science students.

Kids World – An international children's festival sponsored by the Tulsa Global Alliance. Kids' World reaches children as they are developing opinions about their place in the world, before they establish prejudices or fears about what they do not know. All of the activities are designed especially for kids. From Italian maskmaking to Japanese origami paper art to communicating with Israeli kids via the Internet, Kids' World puts the excitement of the world in children's hands.

International Student Day – An annual festival hosted at the State Capitol by state officials to celebrate the diversity that international students add to Oklahoma. Opportunities are provided to meet other international students, experience entertaining performers from around the world, learn about Oklahoma, tour the capitol building, and network with state officials, as well as university and business representatives.

World Neighbors – World Neighbors works with the rural poor in 15 countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America to strengthen the ability of individuals and communities to solve their own problems of hunger, poverty, and disease. World Neighbors' programs integrate improved sustainable agriculture, community-based health, reproductive health, environmental conservation, water and sanitation, and livelihood strategies, including savings and credit. The purpose of World Neighbors is to strengthen the capacity of marginalized communities to meet their basic needs, and to determine and sustain an equitable and inclusive development process.

NCTA - Oklahoma Consortium for Teaching about Asia, which is affiliated with The National Consortium for Teaching about Asia. The purpose of the consortium is to foster a permanent place for the teaching and study of Asia in secondary Social Studies courses and to improve education about Asia. Our goal is to have 80% of American middle and high schools teaching serious content in Asian history, geography, and literature within 10 years time. Additionally, to provide teachers with enriched background on Chinese, Japanese and Korean classical traditions, modern history and contemporary issues. To do so, seminar leaders facilitate 30-hour seminars on East Asian history and culture that incorporates primary source selections from the East Asian traditions. Individual seminars are adapted to the needs and curriculum of the participating teachers and school districts to promote long-term engagement in Asian studies by core groups of teachers within schools, districts, and school consortia. NCTA seeks to develop a community of inquiry among educators interested in Asian studies – a forum for examination and discussion of issues in and strategies for teaching about Asia.

16. What is Oklahoma’s goal in the K-16 learning of foreign languages?

The intended goal of OASIS is to realize a statewide increase in the number of students and citizens who learn a foreign language competency.

The Oklahoma State Regents require that all teacher candidates must show proficiency at the novice-high level for any language other than English.

The Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program (OHLAP), a unique program for eighth-, ninth- and 10th-grade students that will help pay for their college education if their family's income is \$50,000 or less, requires a Foreign or non-English language (*two years of the same language*) OR Computer technology.

17. What schools and cities have on-going partnerships with a school in another region of the world?

Schools numbered 1-8 below are represented annually by 10 students and 2 teachers who travel to an international location forming lasting relationships through a reciprocal exchange. The exchange is funded annually by the Freeman Foundation with local oversight provided by the Oklahoma Institute for Teaching East Asia, The University of Oklahoma, Schusterman Center.

Booker T. Washington High School (school number 9 below) received a three-year grant from the State Department for the purpose of exchanging United States students and teachers with an international country.

Carver Middle School (school number 10 below) shares specific curriculum (Anne Frank studies). A student teleconference is conducted upon completion of the study to provide discussion and sharing of ideas.

Grissom Elementary School in Tulsa has a cultural exchange, but does not currently send or receive students and teachers.
