Presenters will include Katherine Robinson Ph.D. , Dean of Arts and Letters, Northeastern State University and Joyce Montgomery, Volunteer Center Coordinator, Oklahoma State University.

2002 Institute on Philanthropy and Voluntary Service Nominations (www.ipvs.org)---The Institute is a six week summer program for undergraduates, co-sponsored by the Indiana University Center on Philanthropy and the Fund for American Studies. Institute students take academic courses on the history and ethics of philanthropy, hold internships in leading nonprofit organizations, and attend weekly dialogues with leaders in the philanthropic and nonprofit sectors.

The Institute will be held in Indianapolis from June 8 to July 19, 2002. Students who attend the program will deepen their understanding of the American philanthropic tradition, enhance their leadership skills, and identify opportunities for fulfilling careers in civic service.

More than 85 percent of students who apply receive scholarships, with an average award of \$2,000 towards a total cost of \$2,950.

Applications will be accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis until April 15, 2002.

The Kellogg Forum will make award selections with a national steering committee comprised of representatives from:

AAHE - American Association of Higher Education

AERA - American Educational Research Association

ASHE - Association for the Study of Higher Education

ACPA - American College Personnel Association

Award: The award of \$3,000 will be made to individuals in order to support outstanding research and encourage publication. Additionally, award recipients will receive support for the following:

* Conference registration fees waived to attend one of the national conferences of a collaborating association. * Participation in the Kellogg Forum Higher Educational Intergenerational Scholars Symposium hosted jointly by the higher education research programs at UCLA and the University of Michigan.

* Inclusion of the manuscript from their project in an annual Kellogg Forum edited monograph and consideration for publication in the peer review journals of the collaborating associations.

Qualifications: All recipients should hold a doctorate (no more than 5 years post degree) or be at the dissertation stage of their doctoral studies; they must also be affiliated with a higher educational institution.

Applications: All applications for the National Rising Scholars Award to Advance Research on Higher Education for the Public Good must include two collated sets of the complete application packet.
